Uptown District Armed Robbery (Carjacking) **Crime Alert Update**

Crime Alert Update

The New Orleans Police Department has arrested four subjects they believe could be connected with the four carjackings and one attempted carjacking that occurred Saturday, January 16, 2022 near or within TUPD's uptown patrol perimeter. (See Saturday's Crime Alert below). The four subjects were arrested Saturday night on unrelated charges and remain in custody. Investigators are working to bring additional charges related to the uptown carjackings and other carjacking incidents that occurred in districts around the city on Saturday. At this time, NOPD is withholding the identity of the arrested individuals pending confirmation of their involvement in Saturday's incidents.

Saturday January 15,2022

1200 Adams St. (11:50 AM), 2200 Audubon St. (1:28 PM), 2814 Palmer St. (1:32 PM), 300 Audubon St. (4:20 PM) and 329 State St. (4:23 PM)

REPORTED OFFENSE:

Armed robbery (carjacking) with a firearm

SUSPECT'S DESCRIPTION:

2 black males, dressed in dark hoodies with light colored pants, armed with a black and silver handgun.

Reported Incident:

This evening the Tulane University Police Department was made aware of multiple carjackings that occurred near or in our patrol perimeter. Subjects approached the victims and demanded their vehicles at gunpoint. NOPD is currently tracking a vehicle believed to be related to the crimes and it is believed that the same subjects are responsible for all five incidents. No injuries to any of the victims were reported.

Descriptions provided by victim/witness.

Information about the race or ethnicity of alleged offenders is provided only to aid detailed descriptions that include physical stature, clothing or unusual characteristics. Racial descriptions do not, by themselves, offer a meaningful picture of an individual's appearance.
