### Uptown District - SEXUAL ASSAULT

# *Content Warning: The following narrative references an incident of sexual assault.*

DATE & TIME OF OCCURRENCE: Wednesday, August 24<sup>th</sup>, 2022 at 10:30 p.m.

LOCATION: Sharp Residential Hall, On-Campus (Residential Facilities)

REPORTED OFFENSE: Sexual Assault

SUSPECT'S DESCRIPTION: No description provided

On August 25<sup>th</sup>, the Tulane University Police Department learned of the following report of sexual assault occurring within the university's geography as defined by *The Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act* or "*Clery Act*." The victim reported that on Wednesday, August 24<sup>th</sup>, at approximately 10:30 p.m. a known male acquaintance followed them into a bathroom located in Sharp Hall. The victim asked him not to follow them and once in bathroom, the known male sexually assaulted them.

*The Clery Act* requires Tulane University to provide safety tips when issuing Crime Alerts. The following are suggestions relative to the criminal incident described in this alert. In addition, the University encourages all members of our community to look out for one another.

- Respect the rights and boundaries of others.
- Make sure that you have clear, affirmative consent before engaging in sexual activity.
- Trust your instincts. If you feel unsafe and are able to do so, get to a safe place and call for help.
- Be alert of your surroundings and the people around you.
- The absence of the word "no" does not constitute consent. Make sure you have consent to sexual contact by asking your partner what they want to do. If your partner seems hesitant or unsure, it is time to stop.

If you have experienced sexual misconduct or think you may have experienced it, help is available. It is not your fault, and there are resources on campus and in the community to provide support and help you heal. Help is available at Tulane, whether a survivor wants to report an incident to the police, the university, a confidential resource or just wants to talk to someone.

## A Note on Reporting:

Reporting sexual assault is a very sensitive and nuanced matter. Delayed reporting of sexual assault is very common. Tulane University encourages any victim of sexual assault or other crime to report, regardless of the time passed since the date of incident.

We at Tulane recognize that deciding to report sexual misconduct and choosing how to proceed are difficult decisions. We recognize that your feelings about whether to report an incident and how to proceed may change over time. We support all survivors of sexual misconduct during this decision-making process.
